

KATHRYN BENTLEY (SHE/HER) | DIRECTOR

is a community-focused artist and an associate professor of theater at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE) as well as the director of the SIUE Black Studies program, director of SIUE's IMPACT Academy, and the artistic director of SIUE's Black Theater Workshop. She has performed and directed with numerous theater companies regionally and nationally, notably directing the 2019 Shakespeare in the Streets production *Love at the River's Edge* with St. Louis Shakespeare Festival. From 2018-2021, she was the artistic director of Bread and Roses Missouri's Workers' Theater project, where she directed the company's first full-length productions of *Jailbird* in 2019 and the radio drama *Mrs. Palmer's Honey* in 2021. She currently serves as an advisory board member for the Regional Arts Commission of St. Louis, where she has been a consultant involved in programming and facilitation for the last 20 years. She is a CDFT (Certified Diversity FaciliTrainer)™ with NCCJ St. Louis and conducts diversity and inclusion trainings throughout the metropolitan area. In 2020, she was granted the Saint Louis Visionary Awards' Outstanding Working Artist award. In 2000, she was instrumental in developing the CHIPS In Motion program at CHIPS Health and Wellness Center in North St. Louis. This program continues to utilize performance to teach the community about pertinent health and wellness issues. Kathryn commits herself to community-engaged arts collaborations, striving to create compassionate artistic experiences and using theater to lift social consciousness.



ISABELLE SCHEIBE (SHE/HER) | STAGE MANAGER

is excited to return to Metro Theater Company after working as assistant stage manager on *Last Stop on Market Street* during MTC's 2021-22 Season. Isabelle graduated from Stephens College with a B.F.A. and is currently studying for a master's in arts management at Colorado State University. When she is not studying, you can find Isabelle working as the theater tech assistant/stage manager at Missouri Baptist University. Isabelle recently finished working on the St. Louis Shakespeare Festival's production of *Much Ado About Nothing* as the associate production manager. Isabelle's stage management work at Missouri Baptist University includes *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers, Big Fish, Peter & the Star Catcher, A Doll's House*, and *Into the Woods*.



NICHOLAS KRYAH (HE/HIS) | SCENIC DESIGNER

It's an understatement to say that Nicholas Kryah wore lots of artistic hats in his 37-year tenure with Metro Theater Company. From the day Zaro Weil hired him in 1977 through 2014, when he stepped down from his post as MTC's resident artist, Nick did it all. He gave over 5,500 performances in roles ranging from Atticus Finch (To Kill a Mockingbird) and Babe Ruth (Jackie and Me) to a Fat Lie (Arm in Arm) and Emcee Dog (Go, Dog. Go!). He wrote plays: Beowulf, Iceman, A Short Hike on a Long Trail, Stix & Stonz, and Talkin' Trash. He directed productions: Tomato Plant Girl, New Kid. Delilah's Wish, and Long Road to Freedom. He served as both actor and stage manager for 14 years of MTC's tours. He designed and built 30 sets that fit in a van yet filled a stage. Tours to Hawaii, Alaska, Japan, Italy, and Taiwan required figuring out how to re-build and pack those sets to ship via air cargo. Nick did that, too. A master organizer and fastidious craftsman, Nick managed MTC's production, construction, and storage space. He knew where every single tool, prop. musical instrument, and costume piece was stored. When MTC moved to its current home in Grand Center, Nick single-handedly built the sprung floor in the large rehearsal hall and designed and built out the scene shop and costume/props storage area. Nick also taught. It is impossible to count the thousands and thousands of young people and educators Nick inspired with his imaginative workshops in school classrooms.

Now, when he isn't traveling or gardening, Nick is in his studio painting, making books, and tapping into the four-year-old that he believes lives inside each of us. His play *Everything is Round* had recent productions at Pollyanna Theatre in Austin and Magik Theatre in San Antonio, Texas. *My Name is Loofa Tutu* is slated for production next season. He created the collages for MTC's 2021 virtual production of Idris Goodwin's *Jacked!* Nick is thrilled to be part of MTC's 50th Anniversary Season, designing for the return of one of his favorite characters, Madeline Delilah, in Mariah L. Richardson's *Bold, Brave, Curious!*

Nick is a graduate of the Conservatory of Theatre Arts (now renamed the Sargent Conservatory of Theatre Arts) with a B.A. from Webster University and an M.A. in dramatic literature, theory, and criticism from Michigan State University. With Carol North, he was honored with the Arts and Education Council's 2014 Lifetime Achievement in the Arts award.



TAIJHA NECOLE SILAS (SHE/THEY) | PROPS MASTER

is a native of Alexandria, Louisiana. She has a Bachelor of Science in theatre with a concentration in performance, directing, and musical theatre from Northwestern State University. Taijha is a faithful sister and alum of Phi Mu Fraternity Kappa lota Chapter, where she served as a committee head every year of her collegiate career as well as the vice president of Greek life at NSULA. Taijha has been performing for more than 10 years with training in music, dance, acting, directing, and tech. Taijha has performed in shows such as *Hairspray*, *Rock of Ages*, *Sister Act*, and Behind the Sheet. She has also directed selections from Love/Sick. Sealed for Freshness, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and The Outsiders. In her career, she has performed professionally as a dancer and host for the Peanuts Block Party at Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio. She is currently an acting fellow with The Black Rep, where she wears many hats by acting with the touring company in *Stamping, Shouting*, and Singing Home and Turn-Up, and making graphics for the social media platform. Taiiha's technical credits include props design and stage management. is a St. Louis-based actor, musician, playwright, and teaching artist, who has worked with Bread and Roses Missouri, St. Louis Shakespeare Festival, A Call to Conscience: Interactive Theater for Social Change (C2C), Intersect Arts Center, and COCA. He was last on stage this spring as Charles Kettering in *Big Machine* at COCA. This fall, he portrays Andrej in RS Theatrics' production of *Once*. Colin comes from a family of musicians and is an experienced songwriter well-versed in the traditions of jazz, blues, and folk music. He wrote the original jazz score for *Mrs. Palmer's Honey*, an 8-part audio play produced by Bread and Roses Missouri premiering later this year. Colin is a resident teaching artist with St. Louis Shakespeare Festival at Sumner High School, a project assistant at CHIPs Health and Wellness Center, and a proud member of The Art Collaborative. He received a Bachelor of Science in social work from Saint Louis University in 2018.



NATHAN LESSLY (HE/THEY) | COSTUME DESIGNER

is a recent St. Louis transplant and is excited to be returning to Metro Theater Company after serving as the costume assistant for *In My Granny's Garden* and *Last Stop on Market Street* during MTC's 2021-22 Season. He spent his childhood in Spearfish, South Dakota, where he was involved in multiple productions at the historic Matthews Opera House, including *Clue: The Musical, Red,* and *Deadeye's Wild West.* He went on to study costuming and musical theatre at the University of Central Oklahoma, where he worked on *The Pirates of Penzance* and (appropriately) *Meet Me in St. Louis.* Currently, he utilizes his sewing skills by stitching for local clients and designers and sewing clothes for himself. Nathan's designs focus on sustainability, using recycled materials, and giving new life to second-hand pieces!

MEET THE PLAYWRIGHT

MARIAH L. RICHARDSON (SHE/HER) | PLAYWRIGHT

Mariah L. Richardson is a playwright and director. She is the author of 12 plays, with the most recent, *The Ville: Avengeance!*, staged as a production of St. Louis Shakespeare Festival's Shakespeare in the Streets (SITS). Her new play, *Bold, Brave, Curious!*, a Madeline Delilah story, which was commissioned by Metro Theater Company, makes its world premiere this fall. Mariah has directed plays and five films. She is also a staff writer and the voice for a new animated series, *Drawn In*, for Nine PBS, which premiered in Summer 2022. Mariah is currently teaching first-year acting at Webster University's Sargent Conservatory of Theatre Arts. Mariah received a B.A. in communications from the University of New Mexico and an M.F.A. from Smith College in playwriting.

JULIA FLOOD (SHE/HER) | ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

has directed Digging Up Dessa, The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show, It's a Wonderful Life, The Girl Who Swallowed a Cactus, The Hundred Dresses, Frida Libre, Bud, Not Buddy, Hans Brinker and the Silver Skates, The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, And In This Corner: Cassius Clay, Out of the Box, Talkin' Trash, Afflicted: Daughters of Salem, Unsorted, and Say Something, Do Something! for Metro Theater Company since she moved to St. Louis to become artistic director in February 2014. Previously, Julia spent 16 years as artistic director of Eckerd Theater Company in Clearwater, Florida where she commissioned such plays as *Vote?*, by Eric Coble, provoked by Florida's role in the 2000 presidential election, and Battledrum by Doug Cooney with Lee Ahlin, a musical about the effects of war on young people through the lens of Civil War drummer boys, subsequently produced at Metro Theater Company. A graduate of Northwestern University, Julia spent seven years as a resident member of the Bloomsburg Theatre Ensemble in Pennsylvania, a unique artist-led ensemble founded under the guidance of legendary acting teacher Alvina Krause, before following a freelance career as actor/director/playwright/teacher. Julia served on the national board of directors of Theatre for Young Audiences/USA from 2011 to 2019, and brings more than 40 years of experience to her role as artistic director of Metro Theater Company.



JOE GFALLER (HE/HIM) | MANAGING DIRECTOR

joined the Metro Theater Company team in 2019. During his tenure to date, Metro Theater Company has seen dramatic growth in both its audience base and its donor base. In partnership with Artistic Director Julia Flood, he has co-led the company through its recent evolutions during the COVID-19 pandemic, from its virtual programming to its safe return to live performances. Prior to joining the MTC team, Joe received national recognition for his work in building young, diverse, and national audiences for Opera Theatre of Saint Louis during his tenure as director of marketing and public relations – and for expanding OTSL's civic footprint as the producer of the company's Opera Tastings series, through artist community tours, and the creation and growth of its Engagement + Inclusion Task Force. His career has also included roles with the American Repertory Theater, the Alliance Theater, and 7 Stages, and consulting projects for the National Blues Museum, the Utah Symphony, and the documentary film Flint: The Poisoning of an American City. He has directed over two dozen professional or university productions, including regional premieres by David Mamet, Caryl Churchill, and others. A graduate of Harvard University, he also serves as adjunct faculty at Webster University in the Arts Management and Leadership MFA program.
